Mobile Phone and Electronic Devices Policy

Introduction and Rationale

The possession and use of mobile phones by school students is now extensive, even in the primary school sector. The use of mobile phones and personal devices presents a number of problems that can prove intrusive and distracting in a school environment. They can be used to cause discipline problems or as a means of bullying others. The capacity of many devices to take photographs, make video or sound recordings could lead to child protection and data protection issues with regard to inappropriate capture, use or distribution of images. In order to manage the issue of mobile phones, and other personal devices, this policy has been reviewed and will be reviewed regularly to ensure its appropriateness.

Personal Devices

Personal devices will not be used by children under any circumstances for school based activities. School owned devices (cameras, tablets, iPads, laptops, Chromebooks etc.) will be the only devices used during school hours or school related activities to give best assurances of pupil and staff safety. This does not apply to devices that are granted under assistive technology or are used for medical reasons. Where a device is needed for medical reasons permission must be sought from the Board of Management. The board may request further details from a medical professional.

Smart Watches

Children are not permitted to have smart watches/technology on their person or in their possession. This includes smart watches during the school day. A smart watch is defined as a watch with the ability to make/receive calls, send/receive messages, take photographs, video /audio record and launch different apps. A simple wrist watch is allowed. If an allowed device is deemed to be of constant distraction, teachers at their discretion may ask that the device is removed.

Relationship to Our School Ethos

The use of mobile phones and other electronic devices contravenes the provision of a happy,



secure and friendly school environment and is not conducive to learning - a provision that is central to the mission statement and ethos of Scoil Bhríde.

Aim of Policy

School Management is introducing a policy that prohibits the use by students of mobile phones, and other personal devices, while on school premises or involved in school activities such as tours, trips or extra-curricular activities. This is in order to create a safer environment and to lessen intrusions on, and distractions to, children's learning.

School Procedures

- The use of mobile phones by children who attend the school is not allowed while the children are in the care of the school staff, while at school, on trips from the school or involved in extracurricular activities. The children should, therefore, not bring mobile phones and other personal devices to school or when engaging in school-related activities.
- Mobile phones that are found in the school should be handed to a member of staff.
- Children who need to contact home during school hours may do so through the School Secretary or Principal using the School landline phone (01) 6272255.
- Parents are reminded that in cases of emergency, the School Office remains the first point of contact and can ensure that your child is reached quickly and a message passed onto them.

Sanctions

- Any child found to intentionally have a phone in school without permission will have the phone confiscated. The phone will not be returned until a parent/guardian collects it. Similarly, the use of all personal electronic devices is not permitted during the school day this includes arrival, class time, breaks and dismissal.
- Where a pupil is found by a member of staff to be using a mobile phone or other personal device for any purpose, it will be confiscated from the pupil and returned only to the parent/guardian.
- The School will not be liable for replacing mobile phones or other devices that are lost, stolen or damaged.
- The School incorporates this policy into the Code of Behaviour and Discipline and Acceptable Use Policy, and will treat breaches in the same manner as any other



breach of these Policies.

If a pupil uses a mobile phone or personal device to take photographs, video footage
or recording of other pupils or staff members, or shares inappropriate messages via
Bluetooth or other methods, this will be regarded as a gross misbehaviour and
disciplinary action will be taken in accordance with the School's Code of Behaviour.

Code of Behaviour

It should be noted that it is a criminal offence to use a mobile phone/personal device to menace, harass or offend another person. As such, if action as sanctioned by the School in this regard is deemed ineffective, as with all such incidents, the School may consider it appropriate to involve the Gardaí.

Digital Devices & Anti Bullying

Parents should note that our Anti Bullying Policy currently states:

"in the context of this policy, placing a once-off offensive or hurtful public message, image or statement on a social network site or other public forum where that message, image or statement can be viewed and/or repeated by other people will be regarded as bullying behaviour."

School Trips and Outings

Children are not permitted to bring mobile phones with them on school trips and tours. During school trips and outings, teachers will have a contact number in the event that it is necessary to make contact with a parent/guardian.

Where children are found to be using digital devices or have them on their person it will be confiscated by the Principal and parents will have to collect the device by appointment and the children will be dealt with under the Straffan NS Code of Behaviour. Sanctions will apply according to the school's Code of Behaviour Policy.



Guidelines for Parents

- The Staff and BOM recognise the parents as the child's primary educator and believe that parents have an important role to play in ensuring their child's appropriate and safe use of electronic devices.
- Parents and guardians are encouraged to regularly check their child's online activity
 / digital footprint. Parents are encouraged to check social media apps (e.g.
 Facebook, Snapchat, Viber, WhatsApp, Instagram etc.) on mobile phones and
 electronic devices to ensure they are aware of their child's online interaction with
 others and approve of the same.
- Parents/guardians are encouraged to talk with their child regularly about their use of
 electronic devices and discuss who their child is interacting with and the content of such
 interactions.
- Parents are asked to attend internet safety talks when they are held by the school.

Guidance for Staff on Mobile Phone Usage

At Scoil Bhríde, we recognise the importance of mobile phones for both educational purposes and administrative tasks for staff. This guidance outlines the expectations for mobile phone use within the school setting

1. Educational and Administrative Use:

Teachers use mobile phones for uploading data to the Aladdin system and for other educational tasks. Mobile phones may also be used for taking photographs related to educational activities (e.g., class timers, school website content, Seesaw, parent communication) as long as they align with school policies regarding privacy and data protection.

2. Usage During Teaching and Duty Hours:

During teaching time, playground duty, or meetings, mobile phones should be switched off or set to 'silent' or 'discreet' mode unless being used for specific educational purposes (e.g., timers). This is to minimize distractions and maintain focus on the tasks at hand.

3. Limitations on Phone Calls:

Staff should avoid using mobile phones in front of children. Any phone calls should only be taken or made in emergency situations or under exceptional circumstances during the school day.



4. Contacting Parents:

Staff are reminded to be cautious when using personal mobile phones to contact parents. Personal phone numbers should never be shared with parents for school-related business. If needed, communication with parents should be done through the school's official communication channels.

By adhering to these guidelines, we can ensure that mobile phones serve as a valuable tool for learning and administration while maintaining professionalism and safeguarding our school environment.
